

From the Rectory

More tea Vicar?

Let's be honest there is nothing quite like sitting down for a minute with a cup of tea. Amidst the busy hustle and bustle of life we all welcome a break, if you find your day dragging and seemingly empty there is also nothing quite like breaking the monotony with a cuppa. We all need a break from time to time but how often do we give ourselves a break, how often do we stop to care for ourselves for a moment?

I say this knowing that my family will tell you that, along with most Vicars, I am not the best at stopping for a break, but it is something I know I need – even God sits down for a break in the story of creation, having worked for 6 days he rested on the 7th.

As we rush from one thing to the next of course the question that arises is why? Is it maybe because we are trying to impress the world about us? Is it because we don't feel we can stop, if we did our world would collapse? I read recently of a US bond trading company that spent a fortune running a new fibre optic cable directly, not using the existing cable poles and pipes which crisscross from town to town, but directly from Chicago to the stock exchange in New York. The aim was to have faster connection times and to be able to make a trade on the exchange before others in Chicago could. The new system did save time, by 4 thousandths of 1 second!

Jesus certainly was man who did an awful lot; in the 3 years of his active ministry he walked thousands of miles (no buses or trains back then), he met thousands of people, he talked with them, he healed and helped one and all and yet he also stopped and rested, he stopped and took stock — every day! He seems to have made a point of finding space each day to be away from the hustle and bustle, to be alone with his thoughts about all of life and to be with God. He withdraws from the crowds by a distance, he makes his way up the mountains to the high places; and these times sustained him!

Taking time out each day to stop, maybe taking a few tea breaks gives us time to breathe in again. Taking time out gives us space, space for reflection, time to think and space to connect with God through prayer – be that silent or with words. And this sustains! I wonder where you find space for a break with yourself and maybe with God? Take some time out, like a cup of tea it is amazing how refreshing it can be!

Over the Summer break, our Hut underwent some well-needed renovations, namely in our Store Cupboard.

The building we call home was lovingly sourced for us in the 1980s by our brilliant Group Lead Volunteer, June, but prior to being our home, it belonged to the Houndstone camp in Yeo-

vil. Since then, it's had the odd lick of paint and general maintenance (most recently on the exterior, thanks to the team from Leonardos on their Be-A-Saint-Day), but never a major project.

A consequence of this was a lack of attention paid to our store cupboard. Over the years, as many people will know, stuff began to accumulate, and the fix-it-later pile had grown rather large. Two of our Explorer Leaders decided that this summer was the perfect time to do something about it. After extensive discussions with the Group Leadership Team and a generous donation offer to kick-start the plan, the ball began to roll.

The first step was to empty the cupboard, which was no mean feat and resulted in some surprise finds, including a couple of old-style patrol tents. From there, we were able to measure up the area and work out what we needed to do.

The plan was divided into a few stages over 6 weekends, starting on the 26th of July and finishing on the 30th of August, but also included many late-night weeknights in between. It was a labour of love, but the effort has been worth it; the tidier stores mean that kit has a longer lifespan, and leaders know what they have at their disposal, allowing more young people to learn skills for life through our beloved Scout Group.

Skate Park Removal



Skate Park Removal

Ilchester Town Trust would like to thank everyone for their patience and engagement as we explored options for the skate park since its transfer to the Trust in May. Despite contacting several companies, none were willing to take responsibility for modifying the existing structure, as this would leave them liable for future safety issues.

Our insurers have advised that any incident arising from the skate park's failure to comply with British Standards would be excluded from insurance, leaving the Trust financially liable. This means the facility cannot be considered safe to retain in its current condition. As a Trust, our foremost responsibility is to protect all users, particularly children. It is therefore with deep regret that we must announce the removal of the existing skate park.

As many of you know, the Trust is a charity run almost entirely by volunteers, including those who organise successful car boot sales that help raise vital funds. However, the cost of replacing the skate park is far beyond what the Trust can generate financially, especially alongside the ongoing responsibility of maintaining the sportsfield and Town Hall for the community.

Looking forward, the Trust is reviewing leisure facilities at the sportsfield (excluding the football pitches) with the aim of providing amenities for a wider cross-section of the community. We would greatly value your input in shaping this vision and warmly invite you to attend a meeting on **Monday 20th**October at 6.30pm in the Town Hall to share your ideas. Together, we can plan the next chapter for our community spaces.
